The California School Facilities Research Institute (CSFRI) has Partnered with Bellwether to Launch Groundbreaking Study on the Impact of Rebuilding Schools on Student Success

Sacramento, CA – Wednesday, October 8, 2025 – The California School Facilities Research Institute (CSFRI), in partnership with Bellwether, has announced a new research initiative titled *From Bricks to Outcomes: Evaluating the Effects of Facility Investments in California.* This study will be a rigorous examination on how rebuilding and modernizing aging Pre-K–12 schools influences student academic achievement and attendance.

With California facing billions in deferred maintenance and modernization needs, policymakers, regulators, and school facility planners need clear evidence to guide investments. This study will analyze capital expenditures across California districts over nearly a decade, integrate student performance and attendance data, and provide actionable recommendations for state leaders and school facility professionals.

"This research will provide the evidence needed to ensure taxpayer dollars are spent wisely while maximizing benefits for students and communities."

Bellwether will employ a mixed-methods approach, combining statewide quantitative analysis with in-depth studies from diverse California districts. The findings are projected to be presented publicly at the CASH Annual Conference in February 2026, with a comprehensive report and policy handouts made available to legislators, regulators, and the broader education community.
